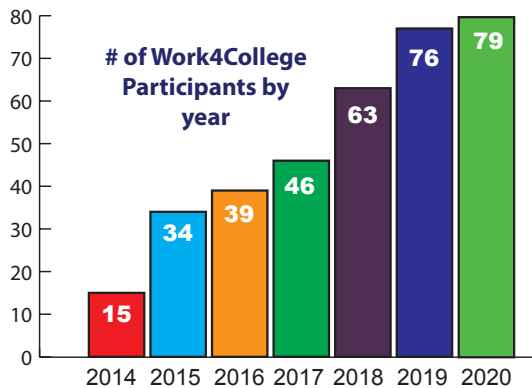


This Program Really **WORKS!**



The Work4College Program at Northeast Texas Community College (NTCC) is making an impact on our community. Students are learning to work while saving money for college at the same time! As you can see from the chart on the left the program has grown from 15 students in 2014 to 79 students in 2020. We have also branched the program out from the college to two local high school campuses. Almost 300 students have benefitted from the Work4College Program so far. This summer we hope to have more than 80 students participate in the program.



As the program grew, so did the workload involved with keeping it running smoothly. NTCC was fortunate to receive a \$470,000 grant from the Greater Texas Foundation that has allowed us to hire a full-time Director of the Work4College Program.
